



DESCRIPTION

Third generation Power MOSFETs from Vishay utilize advanced processing techniques to achieve extremely low on-resistance per silicon area. This benefit, combined with the fast switching speed and ruggedized device design that Power MOSFETs are well known for, provides the designer with an extremely efficient and reliable device for use in a wide variety of applications.

The D²PAK is a surface mount power package capable of accommodating die sizes up to HEX-4. It provides the highest power capability and the lowest possible on-resistance in any existing surface mount package. The D²PAK is suitable for high current applications because of its low internal connection resistance and can dissipate up to 2.0 W in a typical surface mount application.

The through-hole version (IRSiHF9Z34L/SiHF9Z34L) is available for low-profile applications.




Fig. 1 - Typical Output Characteristics




Fig. 2 - Typical Output Characteristics

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


Fig. 3 - Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig. 4 - Normalized On-Resistance vs. Temperature




Fig. 5 - Typical Capacitance vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Fig. 6 - Typical Gate Charge vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage






Fig. 7 - Typical Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




Fig. 8 - Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig. 9 - Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature




Fig. 10a - Switching Time Test Circuit




Fig. 10b - Switching Time Waveforms






Fig. 11 - Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case




Fig. 12a - Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit




Fig. 12b - Unclamped Inductive Waveforms





Fig. 12c - Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Drain Current








Fig. 13a - Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Drain Current
