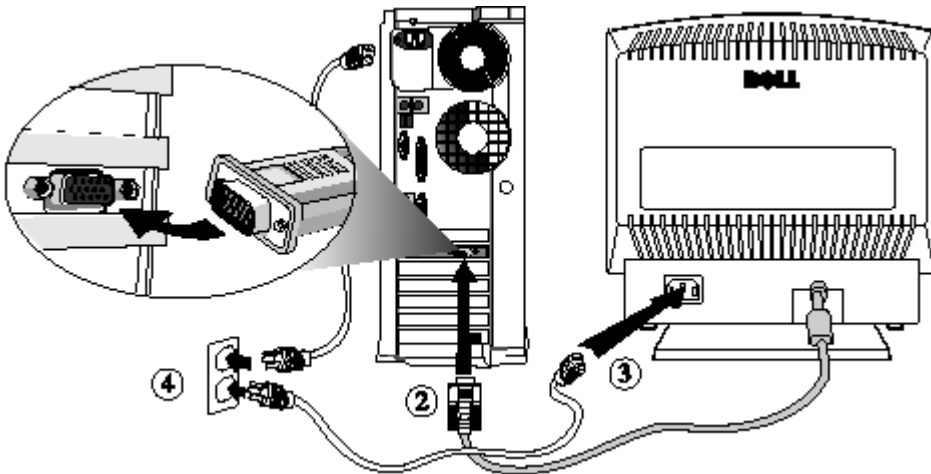


Attaching the Cables: Dell™ UltraScan P780 Color Monitor

Cable Connections On Back of Monitor and Computer

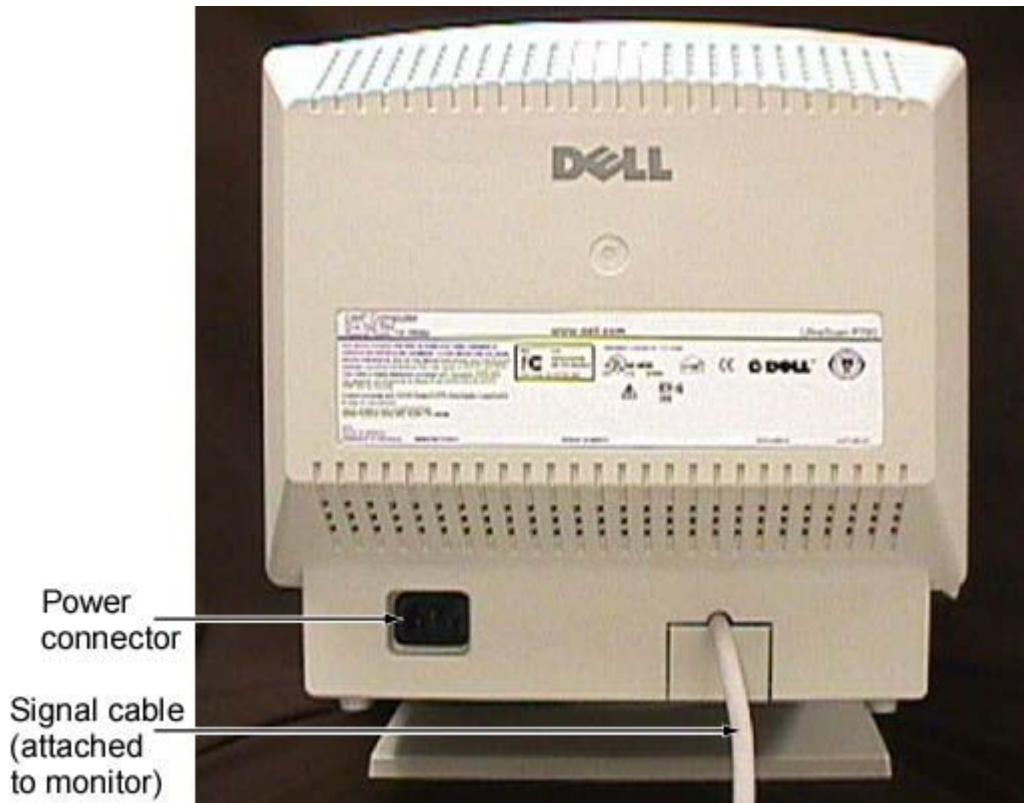


1. Turn off your computer and unplug its power cable.
2. Connect the blue connector of signal cable to the blue video port on the back of your computer.
3. Connect the power cable for your monitor to the power port on the back of the monitor.
4. Plug the power cables of your computer and your monitor into a nearby outlet.
5. Turn on your monitor and computer.

If your monitor displays an image, installation is complete. If it does not display an image, see [Troubleshooting](#).

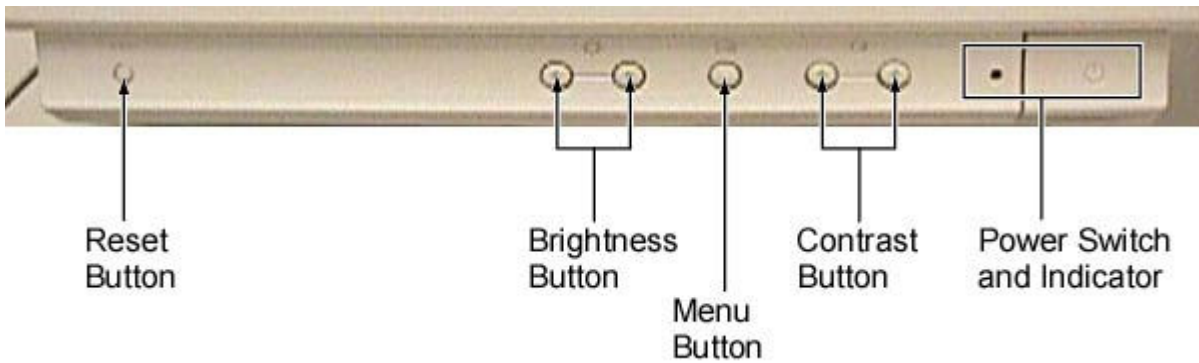

Overview

Use the control buttons on the front of the monitor to adjust the characteristics of the image being displayed. As you use these buttons to adjust the controls, an on-screen display (OSD) shows their numeric values as they change.





Button Name

Description

 Reset button

Resets the adjustments to the factory settings.



 Brightness buttons


Adjust the picture brightness. Operate as the  /  buttons when adjusting other items.

 Menu button

Displays the MENU OSD.

 Contrast buttons

Adjust the contrast. Operate as the  /  buttons when adjusting other items.

 Power switch and indicator (LED)

Turns the monitor on and off. The indicator lights up green when the monitor is on, and lights up orange when the monitor is in Power Saving mode.

Introducing the On Screen Display (OSD) System

1. Press the MENU button to display the Main MENU on your screen.

2. Use the ☀ (BRIGHTNESS) ↓/↑ buttons to highlight/select the desired function.

3. Press the  (MENU) button to activate the desired function.

4. The left and right arrow button can be used for making the actual adjustments.

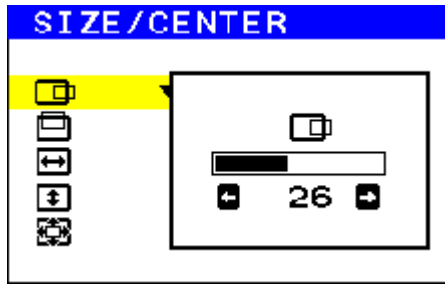
If the ☀ ↓/↑ buttons are held down, the functions are selected circularly in intervals of one second.

Automatic Save

Once an adjustment is made it is automatically saved for the specific timing used during the adjustment. The monitor can be reset to factory settings if necessary (see [Recall Features](#)).

Overview


The Dell UltraScan P780 17 inch (16 VIS) color monitor is loaded with features at an affordable price that's perfect for the demanding corporate professional. Whether you are purchasing your first computer or maintaining product consistency through the corporate rank and file, you will appreciate what the UltraScan P780 monitor has to offer. The UltraScan P780 Color Monitor has a flat CRT that helps minimize geometric distortion and reduces reflective glare that may cause eyestrain. The 17-inch (16 VIS) monitor segment has been around for a while, so you don't have to worry about a new technology being introduced rendering your current UltraScan P780 monitor obsolete.

- The **screen** surface is coated with a special thin optical coating to ensure the ergonomic characteristics. To ensure the optical performance of the coating, clean the screen surface lightly with a soft cloth. If necessary, use a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solution (non-abrasive) diluted with water to remove hand oils or fingerprints, etc. Do not use any type of abrasive pad, scouring powder or any type of solvents containing an alcohol, benzene or similar additive as they may cause damage to the anti-reflective coating. Do not rub, touch, or tap the screen surface with sharp or abrasive items such as a ball-point pen. This contact may result in a scratched screen surface.
- To clean the monitor **cabinet**, use a cloth lightly dampened with a mild detergent.
- Wipe off stubborn stains from the **cabinet** with a cloth lightly dampened in alcohol (methyl, ethyl, or isopropyl). Do not use benzene, thinner, ammonia, abrasive cleaners, or compressed air.

For optimal monitor performance while using the Microsoft® Windows® 98, Windows 95, or Windows NT® operating systems, set the display resolution to 1024 x 768 pixels by performing the following steps:

1. Click the **Start** button, point to **Settings**, and click **Control Panel**.
2. Double-click the **Display** icon in the **Control Panel** window, and then click the **Settings** tab.
3. In the **Desktop** area, move the slider to 1024 by 768 pixels. Then click **OK**.

Your purchase has also contributed to reducing the burden on the environment and also to the further development of environmentally adapted electronics products.

Why do we have environmentally labeled computers?

In many countries, environmental labeling has become an established method for encouraging the adaptation of goods and services to the environment. The main problem, as far as computers and other electronics equipment are concerned, is that environmentally harmful substances are used both in the products and during their manufacture. Since it is not so far possible to satisfactorily recycle the majority of electronics equipment, most of these potentially damaging substances sooner or later enter nature.

There are also other characteristics of a computer, such as energy consumption levels, that are important from the viewpoints of both the work (internal) and natural (external) environments. Since all methods of electricity generation have a negative effect on the environment (e.g. acidic and climate-influencing emissions, radioactive waste), it is vital to save energy. Electronics equipment in offices is often left running continuously and thereby consumes a lot of energy.

What does labeling involve?

This product meets the requirements for the TCO'99 scheme which provides for international and environmental labeling of personal computers. The labeling scheme was developed as a joint effort by the TCO (The Swedish Confederation of Professional Employees), Svenska Naturskyddsforeningen (The Swedish Society for Nature Conservation) and Statens Energimyndighet (The Swedish National Energy Administration).

Approval requirements cover a wide range of issues: environment, ergonomics, usability, emission of electric and magnetic fields, energy consumption and electrical and fire safety.

The environmental demands impose restrictions on the presence and use of heavy metals, brominated and chlorinated flame retardants, CFCs (freons) and chlorinated solvents, among other things. The product must be prepared for recycling and the manufacturer is obliged to have an environmental policy which must be adhered to in each country where the company implements its operational policy.

The energy requirements include a demand that the computer and/or display, after a certain period of inactivity, shall reduce its power consumption to a lower level in one or more stages. The length of time to reactivate the computer shall be reasonable for the user.

Labeled products must meet strict environmental demands, for example, in respect of the reduction of electric and magnetic fields, physical and visual ergonomics and good usability.

Environmental requirements

Flame retardants

Flame retardants are present in printed circuit boards, cables, wires, casings and housings. Their purpose is to prevent, or at least to delay the spread of fire. Up to 30% of the plastic in a computer casing can consist of flame retardant substances. Most flame retardants contain bromine or chloride, and those flame retardants are chemically related to another group of environmental toxins, PCBs. Both the flame retardants containing bromine or chloride and the PCBs are suspected of giving rise to severe health effects, including reproductive damage in fish-eating birds and mammals, due to the bio-accumulative processes. Flame retardants have been found in human blood and researchers fear that disturbances in foetus development may occur.

The relevant TCO'99 demand requires that plastic components weighing more than 25 grams must not contain flame retardants with organically bound bromine or chlorine. Flame retardants are allowed in the printed circuit boards since no substitutes are available.

Cadmium**

Cadmium is present in rechargeable batteries and in the colour-generating layers of certain computer displays. Cadmium damages the nervous system and is toxic in high doses. The relevant TCO'99 requirement states that batteries, the colour-generating layers of display screens and the electrical or electronics components must not contain any cadmium.

Mercury**

Mercury is sometimes found in batteries, relays and switches. It damages the nervous system and is toxic in high doses. The relevant TCO'99 requirement states that batteries may not contain any mercury. It also demands that mercury is not present in any of the electrical or electronics components associated with the labeled unit.

CFCs (freons)

The relevant TCO'99 requirement states that neither CFCs nor HCFCs may be used during the manufacture and assembly of the product. CFCs (freons) are sometimes used for washing printed circuit boards. CFCs break down ozone and thereby damage the ozone layer in the stratosphere, causing increased reception on earth of ultraviolet light with e.g. increased risks of skin cancer (malignant melanoma) as a consequence.

Lead**

Lead can be found in picture tubes, display screens, solders and capacitors. Lead damages the nervous system and in higher doses, causes lead poisoning. The relevant TCO'99 requirement permits the inclusion of lead since no replacement has yet been developed.

* *Bio-accumulative is defined as substances which accumulate within living organisms*

** *Lead, Cadmium and Mercury are heavy metals which are Bio-accumulative.*





- To help avoid damaging your computer, be sure that the voltage selection switch on the power supply is set to match the alternating current (AC) power available at your location:
 - 115 volts (V)/60 hertz (Hz) in most of North and South America and some Far Eastern countries such as Japan, South Korea, and Taiwan.
 - 230 V/50 Hz in most of Europe, the Middle East, and the Far East

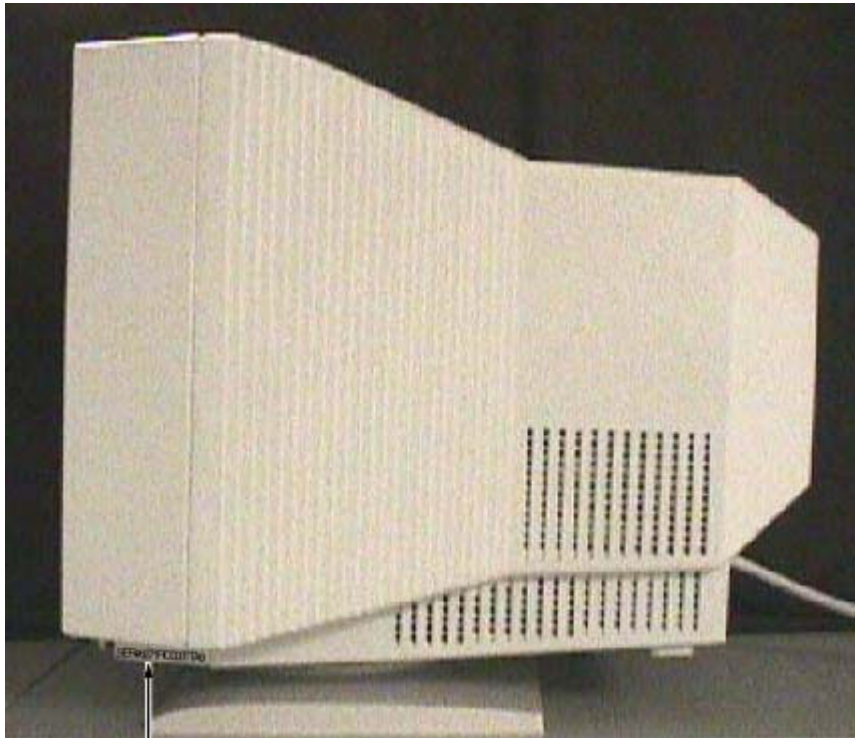
Also be sure that your monitor is electrically rated to operate with the AC power available in your location.

- Never insert anything metallic into the monitor openings. Doing so may create the danger of electric shock.
- To avoid electric shock, never touch the inside of the monitor. Only a qualified technician should open the monitor's case.
- Never use your monitor if the power cable has been damaged. Do not allow anything to rest on the power cable, and keep the cable away from where people could trip over it.
- Be sure to hold the plug, not the cable, when disconnecting the monitor from an electric socket.
- Openings in the monitor cabinet are provided for ventilation. To prevent overheating, these openings should not be blocked or covered. Also, avoid using the monitor on a bed, sofa, rug, or other soft surface. Doing so may block the ventilation openings in the bottom of the cabinet. If you put the monitor in a bookcase or some other enclosed space, be sure to provide adequate ventilation.
- Put your monitor in a location with low humidity and a minimum of dust. Avoid places like damp basement or dusty hallways.
- Do not expose the monitor to rain or use it near water (in kitchens, next to swimming pools, etc.). If the monitor accidentally gets wet, unplug it and contact an authorized dealer immediately. You can clean the monitor with a damp cloth when necessary, but be sure to unplug the monitor first.
- Place the monitor on a solid surface and treat it carefully. The screen is made of glass and can be damaged if dropped or sharply hit.
- Locate your monitor near an easily accessible electric outlet.
- If your monitor does not operate normally - in particular, if there are any unusual sounds or smells coming from it - unplug it immediately and contact an authorized dealer or service center.
- Do not attempt to remove the back cover, as you will be exposed to a shock hazard. The back cover should only be removed by qualified service personnel.
- High temperatures can cause problems. Don't use your monitor in direct sunlight, and keep it away from heaters, stoves, fireplaces, and other sources of heat.
- Unplug the monitor when it is going to be left unused for an extended period of time.
- Unplug your monitor from the electric outlet before any service.

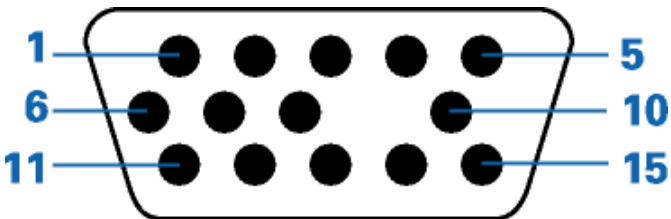

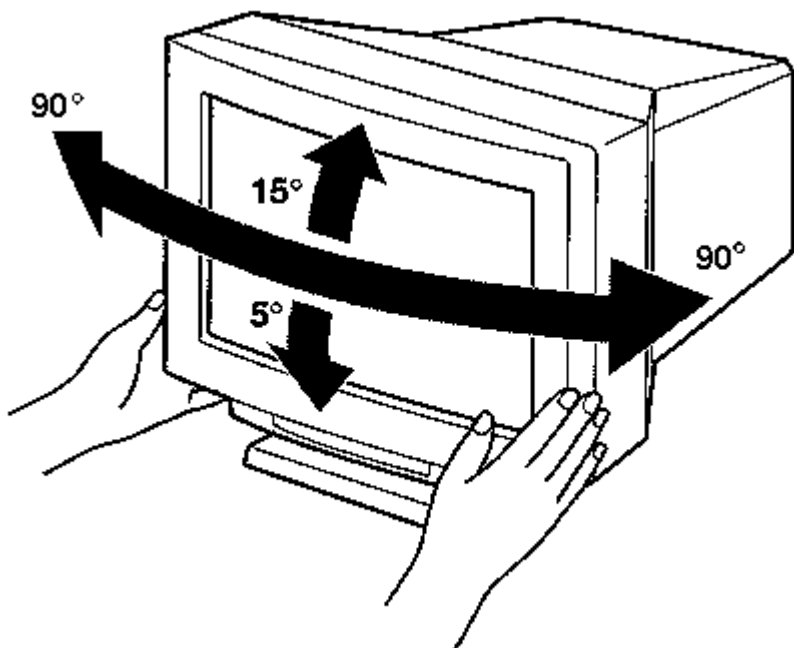

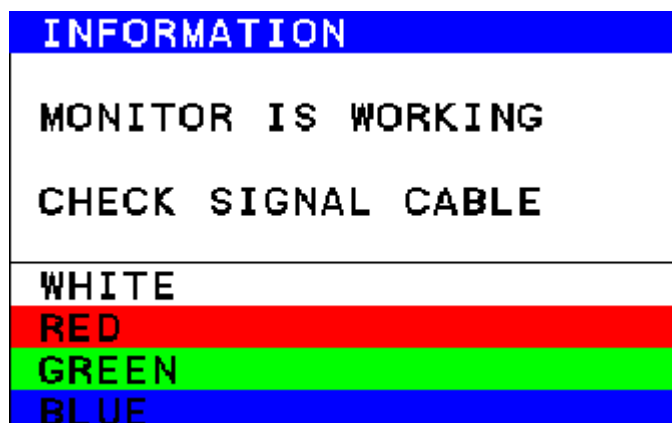
Monitor Specific Troubleshooting

Self-Test Feature Check (STFC)

Your monitor provides a self-test feature that allows you to check whether your monitor is functioning properly. If your monitor and computer are properly connected but the monitor screen remains dark, run the monitor self-test by performing the following steps:

1. Turn off your monitor.
2. Unplug the video cable from the back of the computer.
3. Turn on the monitor and wait for five seconds.

If the monitor is functioning properly, you will see a box as shown in the following illustration:



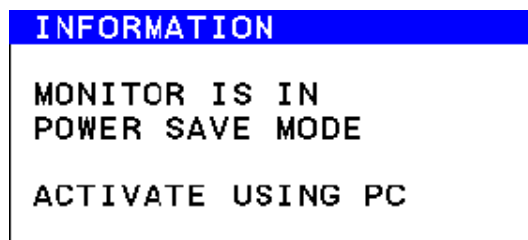
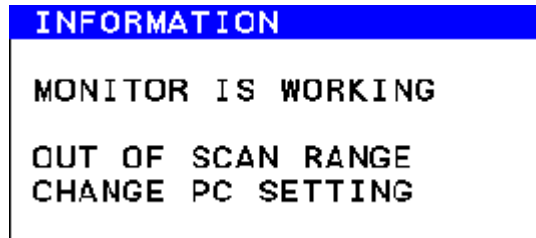
This box also appears during normal system operation if the video cable becomes disconnected or damaged.

1. Turn off your monitor and reconnect the video cable; then turn on both your computer and the monitor.
2. While in self-test mode, the LED remains green and the pattern remains on for 30 seconds.

If your monitor screen remains blank after you use the previous procedure, check your video controller and computer system; your monitor is functioning properly.

On-Screen Warning Messages

If there is something wrong with the input signal, a message appears on the screen or the screen goes blank although the power indicator LED is still on. The message may indicate that the monitor is out of scan range or that you need to activate it using your computer.

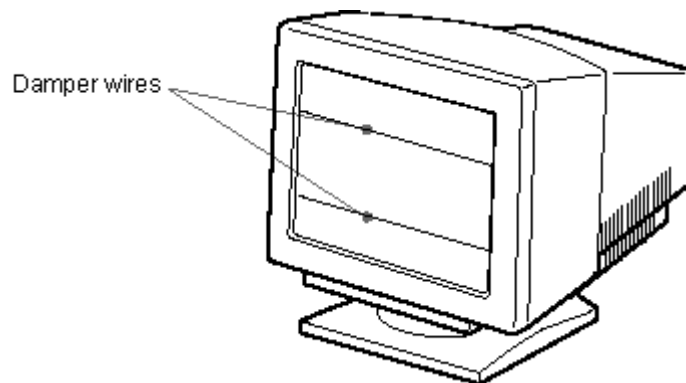
